Our New Sunshine Child

As some of you already know, El Monte Lodge 1097 has sponsored Miss Amanda Condon, for admission to Mooseheart. Amanda and her grandmother, Jean Condon, traveled to Chicago on Tuesday, February 11th, 2003, and she will enter Mooseheart officially on Wednesday, February 12th, 2003. The decision to sponsor her was made by the Board of Officers, in mid December, but due to Moose rules, we were not allowed to give any information to members until we received official notification of her acceptance and a definite date of admission. Under Mooseheart rules, it is the responsibility of a child's family to cover the cost of travel from their home, to Mooseheart. The family members were unable or unwilling to meet this obligation, so the Lodge was asked to fund her travel. We were also asked to provide Amanda with an appropriate sum to allow her to purchase personal items during the first six to ten weeks of her stay, so that when she goes on occasional trips to town with other classmates, she will have money to spend like them. After being at Mooseheart for a few weeks, she will be given small jobs to do, and for this, she will be awarded points which convert to cash for her personal use. Those funds were donated personally by the Officers, and two friends named at the end of this letter. It has been suggested by some members that we set up a savings account to be administered by the Board of Officers, so that she can receive cash or gifts for birthday and holidays, and also to provide her with a college fund if she is able and wishes to pursue a higher education, after her stay at Mooseheart. A number of members have already stated their willingness to support this fund. If you would like to participate in this venture, please give your donation to any Lodge Officer. The amount give to Amanda for her immediate needs was \$280.00, donated by: Dale McDonald, Craig Tullgren, Art Begg, Jan Russell, George Hobby, David Mosse, Mike Janowick, Roy Girtman, Joe Torres, Stan Meaders, Frank Resendez, Garry Moore, Jim Glen, and Martin Montague in equal amounts.

We've had many under the weather with the cold & flu. Hope to see you soon.

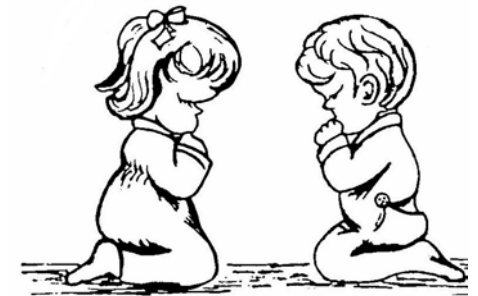

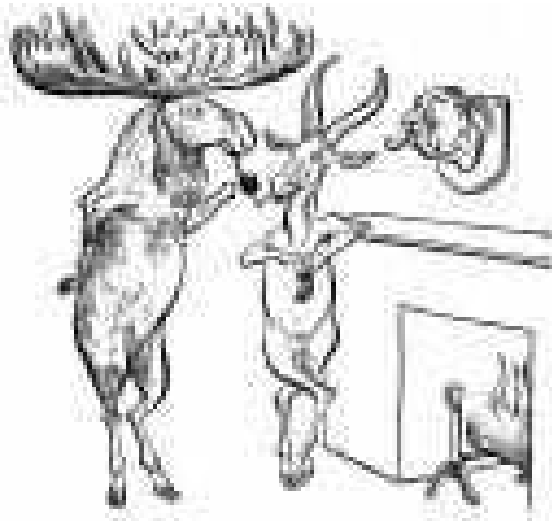

Doing so maintains our rights as a private organization - and can, quite literally, save your Lodge (and you) from financial ruin.

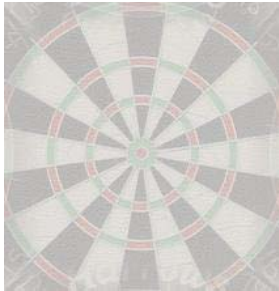
